

Roles and Responsibilities of a Regional Network Representative

Term: 3-year term (Jan-Dec)

The regional network representatives have a demonstrated interest in BCNU's ongoing commitment to human rights and equity.

The regional network representatives are elected by the young nurses within the applicable region as per BCNU policy 5.4.11.

Roles and Responsibilities

1. Educate the membership

The regional network representatives play a key role in providing ongoing education to the membership on human rights, equity and issues pertaining to the network and cross caucus and network activity.

2. Attend network meetings

The regional network representatives are expected to attend (whenever possible) the two annual network meetings. If the regional network representatives are unable to attend, they will ensure that their designate is provided with the necessary background information to adequately represent the region at the network meeting.

3. Identify regional network issues and report out at network meeting

The regional network representatives are expected to present a written report of regional issues/events/activities that pertain to the interests/concerns of the network at the meeting.

4. Report to region

The regional network representatives are expected to provide a written and/or verbal report to their regional executive of the key issues discussed at the network meeting.

5. Create regional networks

The regional network representatives are expected to work with the regional executive to establish a regional network and/or to liaise with the regional representatives of the other caucuses and networks to seek common ground and common purpose.
