Support for Universal Pharmacare

BCNU supports a national, universal pharmacare plan and is encouraging all active and retired members to reach out to their local MPs about <u>Bill C-213</u>, the <u>Canada Pharmacare Act</u>.

The bill was tabled back in February 2020 by the federal NDP. It aims to establish a universal, single-payer, comprehensive and public pharmacare plan that will deliver better health care and improve the health and lives of millions of Canadians.
