Pension Review Committee Recommends Distinct Nurses Group within Plan

The Pension Review Committee (PRC) was established to ensure a pension plan structure is in place to give nurses a voice in any future changes to their pension plan.

The PRC has now completed its review of three options:

1. Creation of a separate Nurses Pension Plan,
2. Creation of a distinct group within the Municipal Pension Plan (MPP), and
3. To remain status quo within the MPP.

PRC announced on Oct. 6 it reached a joint agreement on a recommendation to the MPP Partners to consider creating a distinct group within the Plan. This recommendation is a significant step to achieving a separate group for nurses. Plan Partners must confirm that forming a separate group for nurses will not adversely impact other members of the plan. There must also be a review to determine what changes may be necessary to support a new group.

Once the parties have completed this work, BCNU will ask members, including retired members, to make the final decision through a vote on whether to maintain status quo as members of the MPP or to begin forming a separate group within the MPP. More details will be provided prior to the vote.

COVID-19: Booster Shots for BC Seniors

On Oct. 26, the BC government announced everyone in BC will be offered a COVID-19 booster shot to increase protection against infection that may have waned since the initial series of vaccines. Seniors 70+ in BC will be invited to book a booster appointment by risk level, age group (oldest to youngest based on year of birth) and the date of your second dose.

To be invited, you must be registered with BC's Get Vaccinated provincial registration system. You can register with your Personal Health Number (PHN) [at this website](#) or by phone at 1-833-838-2323.
